Christian Daude is an economist at the Development Centre's Latin America and Caribbean Desk where he coordinates the annual flagship report *Latin American Economic Outlook*. Before joining the OECD Development Centre, he worked as a research economist at the Inter-American Development Bank as well as an economist at the European Central Bank's International Policy Analysis Division. Christian has also worked as a researcher on pension reforms and macroeconomic issues at CINVE-Uruguay, a non-partisan think tank, and taught several courses in economics and econometrics. His primary research fields are development economics and international macroeconomics in emerging markets. He has written extensively on FDI and capital flows to emerging markets, as well as business cycle fluctuations, sovereign debt problems, and growth and productivity dynamics in Latin America.

Christian holds an M.A. and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Maryland at College Park, and did his undergraduate studies in economics at the Universidad de la República in Montevideo, Uruguay.
