

Bio of Undersecretary Treviño

Humberto Treviño Landois is the Undersecretary of Transport of the United Mexican States since April 7, 2008. Prior to his current role, he was General Director of CAPUFE (a Federal Agency Operating Toll Roads) from January 2007 to April 2008, and Representative both in the federal (from 1997 to 2000) and local congresses (from 1991 to 1994 and from 2000 to 2003) and City Counselor at Monterrey (from 1988 to 1991). He has also been President of the PAN party at the State level and member of the National Council. Also, it was member of the team of transition of the elect President Vicente Fox, and it coordinated the Sector Communications and Transports in 2000. His previous professional engagements include positions in the areas of finance and strategic planning for companies such as Hylsa and Banamex. He has been advisor and Board Member of top-rated companies such as Proeza and Grupo Gamesa and founder of a consulting company in technological applications, strategic planning and innovation. In the academic field, he has been lecturer for the Universidad Autónoma de Nuevo León and Monterrey's Technical Institute (ITESM). Undersecretary Treviño holds a BA in Engineering and an MBA with an orientation to finance and strategic planning from Monterrey's Technical Institute (ITESM) in Monterrey. He also has an MA in industrial engineering with a major in operations research from the University of Lancaster in England.
