Inmaculada Martínez-Zaroso holds a PhD in International Economics from the University of Birmingham, England. Currently, she is Apl Professor (Germany) and chair of the U4 Network on Social Sciences Economics and Law at the University of Göttingen. She is board member of the Centre for Global Migration Studies, research fellow at the Center for Statistics and the Center for European Governance and Economic Development Research from the same university and board member of the International Network for Economic Research (INFER). She is also part-time Professor of Economics at the University Jaume I (Spain) since 2012 and member of the Institute of International Economics (Spain) since 1995. She has advised the World Bank, the OECD, the German Ministry of Development and Cooperation, and the Spanish Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure. Her fields of research include international economics, environmental economics and development economics. She is the author of two books and of numerous articles in international journals, including the Journal of International Economics, the Review of International Economics, Ecological Economics, Environmental and Resource Economics, Journal of Common Market Studies. Her current research interests are in the areas of deep and comprehensive trade agreements, migration and remittances, networks and trade and sustainable global value chains.
